#### Funding for 3 and 4 year olds

If your child will be 3 or 4 on 31st August, you may be able to apply for 30 hours of funded childcare. All 3 and 4 year olds receive 15 hours which is called 'Universal Funding'. If you wish to increase this to 30 hours which is known as 'Extended Funding', you need to check that you are eligible. Please log onto www.childcarechoices.gov.uk to apply for a code before 14th July Once you have received this code you will need to share that information with us and let us know about any changes to sessions.

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### **Leadership Focus**

At nursery, we have several staff who take a leadership role. To raise their profile with parents and celebrate the good work that they do, each month we are going to highlight a different role and provide you with some information.

This month it is our Time to Talk Team: Leanne, Sophie, Tiffany (Mat Leave) & Poonam

At Caldecote, Leanne, Sophie and Tiffany are our current Time to Talk Champions. Poonam (our SENDCO) is also trained as a Champion. They take the lead on developing excellent practice in the staff team. They use a screening tool to measure children's speech, language and communication skills, and respond to the needs of children and families by providing support when needed. The Champions also ensure that information about speech and language development is available to families, and, along with the SEND team, they oversee specific interventions for children who are finding it more difficult to learn to talk. The team also has a role in developing the environment at nursery, so that it is 'communication-friendly'.

Here is an overview of the stages of progression...

When babies are first born they can already hear well. They can see our faces when we hold them close to us. They show lots of interest in our faces. They make little sounds with their mouths and they let us know when they need something by crying.

As they grow, babies start to respond to us more. They watch us and smile with us. They listen and show interest for a little while when we talk and sing songs. They start to make more funny noises 'uuuh' and 'eeeh' and 'guuuuh'. They start to take turns at making sounds with us.



Children learn best from experiences with real things and real people, other children and adults, from playing and talking together. Conversations gradually grow so that they take more and more turns, building longer and more complicated sentences and telling their own stories. They need lots of time to talk!

As their concentration grows, so does their understanding of even more words around them. They start to tell you more, joining words together in new ways, and sometimes in their own ways like, 'I runned outside'. There is a lot to learn and these mistakes are common.


Once they get a bit older, babies show more interest in objects as well as people. They start to recognise the names of familiar things that they see and hear every day. We notice this because they might look at something we say e.g. 'shoes'. They start to point and use actions like 'bye bye' and 'up'. They start to play with their voices more and might make repetitive babble sounds like 'dadadada'. Over time, these babble sounds start to sound a bit more like real words that we can recognise. They won't sound perfect for a while.

Toddlers are busy learning lots of new things. They start to concentrate on playing for longer and they can get frustrated when they find things tricky. They gradually understand more and more words around them and can follow simple instructions like 'get your nappy'. As their words and gestures grow, they can tell you a bit more, typically starting to join two words together like 'more milk' or 'bye teddy' by the time they are two years old.























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### **Home Learning Ideas**

Here are some ideas you could try with your child this month...

Talk about sport and keeping healthy by exercising. Ask your child about ways they can move their body - jumping, running, walking, hopping etc. Have a go together.

Think about the change in season and the warmer weather. Ask your child if they know how to stay safe in the sun?

If you are on holiday, talk about all the new sights, sounds and smells. Collect something natural like a pebble or shell as a keepsake for your trip.

Enjoy lots of waterplay in the garden. Use a large storage box or washing up bowl with some simple bowls and spoons to learn about filling and emptying. Add some bubbles and some toys that need a wash and let your child help with the cleaning!

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This month's seasonal recipe to try at home...

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## Hummus Salad Jars – makes 6 jars





Try this easy recipe with your child to get them involved and interested in food! Cooking together is a good way to connect.

#### **Ingredients:**

- 140g frozen soya beans or peas
- 200g tub hummus (reserve 2 tbsp for the dressing)
- 2 red peppers (or a mixture of colours) finely chopped
- Half cucumber, finely chopped
- 200g cherry tomatoes, quartered
- 2 large carrots
- small pack basil
- 2 large carrots, peeled and grated
- 4 tbsp pumpkin seeds (optional)

#### For the dressing:

- zest and juice 1 lemon
- 1 tbsp clear honey
- 2 tbsp hummus (from the tub, above

#### Method:



- 2. Bring a small pan of water to the boil, add the beans or peas and cook for 1 min until tender. Drain and run under cold water until cool.
- Divide the remaining hummus between 6 large jam jars.
- 4. Top with the drained soya beans or peas, peppers, cucumber, tomatoes, basil leaves, carrots and pumpkin seeds, if using.
- Screw on the lids and chill until needed. Will keep in the fridge for 24 hrs.
- When ready to serve, pass around the jars and let everyone pour over a little dressing.
- 7. Perfect for a summer picnic!
